## Ex-10

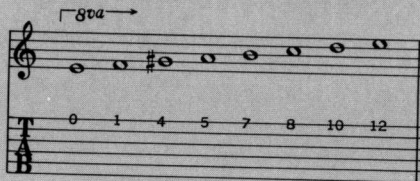

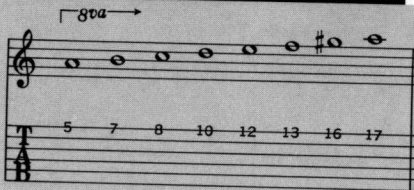

# Ex-19

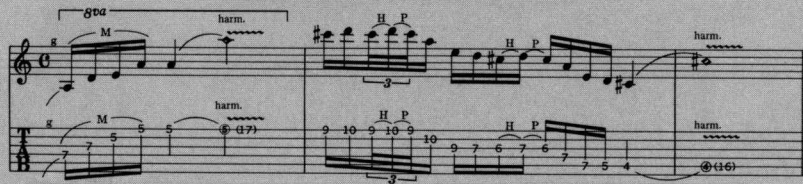

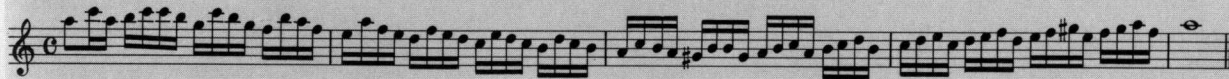
